EXAMPLE FORMATS

CREATIVE WORKSHOPS

Workshops that focus on having fun, trying new things and working collaboratively.

They can look like:

- A dance workshop in a primary school as part of their physical education lesson
- A sensory and craft workshop in a library for families
- A music wokrshop in a secondary school as part of their music lessons
- A drama workshop for staff at a team building day

5-WEEK PROJECTS

Projects consisting of five weekly sessions that focus on fun, building skills, connection and relationships. They can also incorporate a final outcome in order to foster a sense of achievement.

They can look like:

- A drama project in a pupil referral unit which involves the group producing and performing their own new piece of theatre, building their confidence and speaking skills as a result
- A sensory project with a specialist school which responds to their curriculum and uses intensive interaction to develop the young people's communication skills
- A project with a secondary school in which pupils learn backstage theatre skills each week, e.g. puppetry, costume, set design and stage management

OUR WORKSHOP PACKAGES

DRAMA MUSIC SENSORY CRAFT DANCE

EXAMPLE FORMATS

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

Consistent weekly or monthly workshops that provide a regular safe space for participants to have fun, socialise with their peers and work towards a performance or other creative outcome. These projects can look like:

- A music after-school club at a secondary school. Each term the group creates their own song and perform/record it.
- A drop in craft project at a youth club. Each week the group explore different crafting skills and produce artworks to take home.
- A sensory project for a charity working with Disabled people who have higher support needs. Each week the participants experience a new sensory story.



HOLIDAY PROJECTS

Multi-day projects that take place during school holidays.

They can look like:

 A 2-5 day project in your venue where the group play games, learn drama, dance and/or music skills and produce their own piece of theatre to perform in front of friends and family.

The students had a huge amount of fun and it was amazing to see their confidence boost week by week and their excitement to be part of the sessions. It can be difficult for external facilitators to pitch correctly for our students and they just blew us away!
